STAKEHOLDER & ADVISORY GROUP

In the fall of 2021 meetings were held with the Advisory Group, the Inuit Stakeholder Group and the Community Stakeholder group to share findings of the first evaluation report. Ideas for how to move changes forward and fill gaps in services were discussed.



PARTICIPANT INVOLVEMENT

Six participants completed one on one interviews with the external evaluation team. Their experiences and opinions were anonymously shared in the evaluation outlining strengths and weaknesses of the wrap-around model of care.



In 2021 the GBV team delivered cultural training virtually to one project partner. Despite being virtual, the training was well received by participants. Training evaluation forms were also developed during 2021 to ensure staff are able to constantly improve training experiences for participants.

DATA In 2022 the GBV team will continue collecting data from Inuuqatigiit Centre's internal staff. As the organization has grown, so has the amount of internal staff providing data tracking to ensure all parts of the wrap-around model are being taken into account. We will also meet with each department individually to get their opinions on what is working well and where there may be gaps in services that can be filled so we can improve PROJECT programs and services for those affected by gender-based violence.
