Updates on changes that took place from last years recommendations as well as Ideas for how to continue to move changes forward and fill gaps in services were discussed



PARTICIPANT INVOLVEMENT

In 2022, two participants completed one on one interviews with the external evaluation team. Their experiences and opinions were anonymously shared in the evaluation outlining strengths and weaknesses of the wrap-around model of care.



In 2022 the GBV team delivered cultural training virtually to one project partner. The training was well received by participants. The agency took advice on creating a welcoming environment very seriously and the partnership between Inuugatigiit Centre and this partner organization continued to grow.



DATA TRACKING AND PROJECT EVALUATION

DATA
In 2023 the GBV team will continue collecting data from Inuuqatigiit Centre's growing staff. Similar to last year, GBV staff will be meeting with each department again in 2023 to identify what's working well for survivors as well as where front-line staff see gaps in services. With the project ending in 2024 this will be the last opportunity to get each department's feedback in this manner.

The project's evaluation will continue in 2023 with NVision Insight Group Inc.



There will be one or two more Advisory Committee meetings taking place prior to the end of the project in 2024.



There will also be another opportunity for Stakeholder meetings to take place either at the end of 2023 or beginning of 2024.



Inuuqatigiit Centre's GBV Team will continue to provide cultural sensitivity training to partner agencies in 2023. In addition to the current opportunity for partner organizations to book trainings for most or all of their staff, the GBV Team will also be offering a few dates for partner agencies to have the option of a few of their staff attending at a time.
